2. Roll Call

3. Public Comment

Sophie Marczuk mentioned a volunteer program that she and her brother are implementing via Face Book in the area. It was inspired by the Village's HELP program which matches volunteers with older adult residents needing assistance. During the winter months there is a great need for assistance with snow removal. Snow Angels was conceived to try to meet that need. Currently the need for assistance outweighs the number of volunteers. Sophie's brother, Alex is the Admin for the Snow Angel pilot in La Grange Park, he is also a HELP volunteer. Sophie encouraged the Youth Commission to become involved and to promote the idea to friends to continue to build a volunteer base that can meet the number of requests.

4. Village Board Meeting Sign-Up

5. Approval of Minutes – January 11, 2021

6. Review of Village Board Work Session Meeting of February 9, 2021

The commissioners discussed the agenda item (7A) Risk and Resilient Assessment/Emergency Response Plan – Engineering Agreement. Public Works Director Radde explained the memo item. The assessment is basically an audit of security and response to risks that may arise to the Village's water supply. He explained various catastrophic events that may happen that could put a village's water supply in danger such as a tornado or a train derailment. He discussed the reason

for using a consulting firm as well as the benefits of doing so. At the end of the discussion, there was a *Consensus to approve the Motion To Approve a Professional Engineering Agreement for a Risk and Resilient Assessment and Emergency Response Plan in the Amount of \$26,400.00 and to Authorize the Village Manager to Execute Required Documents. The motion was made by Ryan McAllister and seconded by Will Aikens and passed unanimously.*
