


Re: Fire Department Activities – MAY 2023

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of May. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 153. There have been 761 YTD compared to 724 YTD in 2022.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 45. There have been 217 YTD compared to 204 YTD in 2022.

EMS staffing was provided for the Run for the Roses on Mother's Day.

Training was conducted at Plymouth Place during the month for our firefighters, and firefighters from La Grange. Some time was spent on the building design, fire protection systems, and tactical considerations for fires at the main building, along with a familiarization walkthrough and review of the design and building construction types being used in the new construction.

Personnel conducted hands-on training with our new Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus.

Staff volunteered for a fire truck ride to school event, taking children to Ogden Ave. School. Personnel also attended the end of year party for Ready Teddy Preschool.

Fire/EMS personnel were recognized for EMS week, and attended BBQ's at local hospitals.

New plaques were installed at each station to memorialize line of duty death of Fire Chief Tullis.

Staff participated in the MABAS 10 Haz-Mat Response Team incident drill in Clarendon Hills.

Personnel assisted with Memorial Day Weekend event that took place at Memorial Park.

Personnel began using the Village Market south building for training.

Incidents of Note

- **Tuesday, 5/09, 3:31pm – FD responded to an automatic fire alarm at 1639 Forest, and upon arrival found a cooking fire had occurred in a 2nd floor apartment, and spread to the cabinets above. Fortunately, the alarm also alerted residents to the fire and they were able to extinguish it prior to our arrival.**
- **Sunday, 5/28, 8:28 am – FD responded to a home on Oak Ave. where an elderly man suffered a fall in a bathroom and ended up injured against the bathroom door. FD personnel removed a portion of the bathroom window to gain entry in order to safely treat the patient.**

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – MAY 2023

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 153 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 155 patients. There were 125 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 8 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 20 times and received it 11 times. Year to date there has been a total of 761 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 787 patients.

This compares to last year (May 2022) when there were 154 requests for a year to date total of 724 requests.

Training and Continuing Education:

Paramedic and EMT-B continuing education was conducted during the week of May 8th for all EMT-Bs and EMT-Ps. The topic was trauma emergencies.

Probationary Firefighter Joe Schmidt graduated from EMT-B Program at Loyola Medical Center on May 18th and is waiting to take his National EMT-B exam. Probationary Firefighter Mike Clapsaddle passed Loyola EMT-B System entry

Special Activities:


Members provided EMS standby coverage for the annual Run for the Roses event on May 14th.
