Re: Fire Department Activities – AUGUST 2025

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of August. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 186. There have been 1,440 YTD compared to 1,262 YTD in 2024.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 81. There have been 526 YTD compared to 437 YTD in 2024.

Staff participated in a kick-off meeting with ISO, and began gathering data for the Property Protection Classification survey of our Village (for our "ISO rating"). A great deal of work is being done by FD, PW and LTACC.

We received reimbursement check this month from the state for \$17,192.34 for fire training.

Key staff began participating in weekly training meetings, along with other LTACC member fire departments, for our upcoming transition to new fire records and reporting software.

The MABAS 10 Technical Rescue Team conducted familiarization training at Sherwood and Jackson, in relation to the MWRD sewer rehabilitation and relining project taking place.

Firefighters began using the home at 1024 Newberry for various forms of training.

Personnel participated in the Westmont Cruisin' Nights Fire Truck Night.

The Chief participated in a meeting with Argonne Laboratory Emergency Management to review the site hazards, their emergency response organization, and to discuss interagency integration for emergencies.

The FD participated in several public education and relations events, including the Ogden Back to School Bash, the Ace Anniversary Block Party, the Brook-Park Block Party, the Neighbors Helping Neighbors event at Stone-Monroe Park, along with many other block parties. Personnel also escorted Little Leaguers in their Salute to Champions parade.

Deputy Chief Psenicka and Chief Maggos attended the annual Articulation Breakfast to discuss school safety at LTHS south. DC Psenicka assisted with the Violent Critical Incident lockdown drill.

Incidents of Interest

On August 21st the FD responded to the garbage truck crash at 1014 E. 31st St. The driver was initially trapped on the ground outside of the truck by a tree limb that came down on his leg as a result of the crash, and firefighters were able to quickly free him using lifting rescue air bags.

On August 26th the FD responded to a fire in the ComEd transformer vault for the Village Market north building. Personnel were able to enter the vault once ComEd arrived and deenergized the rest of the incoming power, and discovered cabling had burned.



EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – August 2025

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 186 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 193 patients. There were 154 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 21 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 11 times and received it 26 times. Year to date there has been a total of 1,440 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 1,444 patients.

This compares to last year (August 2024) when there were 152 requests for service treating 152 patients and year to date totals were 1,262 requests for service treating 1,273 patients.

Training and Continuing Education:


