Re: Fire Department Activities – DECEMBER 2025

As requested for insertion into the Village Board meeting agenda packet, the following is a brief summary of Fire Department activity highlights for the month of DECEMBER. As usual, a more comprehensive monthly report is kept within the department for your review.

EMS Incidents this month - 200. There have been 1,933 YTD compared to 1,945 YTD in 2024.
Fire/Rescue Incidents this month - 81. There have been 807 YTD compared to 702 YTD in 2024.

The department responded to a record number of incidents this past calendar year, over 2700. We will more closely evaluate the details and reasons for the increase, but we obviously thank our personnel for their dedication.

Work was scheduled to replace the Fire Station No. 2 roof, but had to be delayed due to weather.

Personnel attended and delivered Santa to the Village's Holiday Tree Lighting Event.

Background investigations and medical evaluations were completed for new FD Candidates. An orientation meeting was also held for those being hired.

In conjunction with monthly training, the FD held our annual holiday dinner. Retirees attended and were able to pin their Retirement badges on a new "Retired and Honored Member" display board.

On-duty PM/FF's and the Fire Chief provided an educational presentation to residents of Bethlehem Woods. Fire and fall prevention, wellness, and EMS operations were discussed.

The Santa Parade & Food Drive was held during the month on a day with extremely cold temperatures. Thanks to everyone who helped out in some way with the event, and especially those who braved the cold to help collect the food, and also especially to those who donated.

The Chief and Deputy participated in the School District 95 Annual Crisis Plan meeting.

Our Breakfast with Santa took place for FD families, which is sponsored by the FD Foundation.

The FD Foundation held its' annual corporation meeting, and conducted their annual audit.

Staff have been working for months with other LTACC departments and our vendor ImageTrend, including over the recent holidays, to implement our new fire records management software. It had to go live on January 1st, in order to meet requirements of the new NERIS (the National Emergency Response Information System). DC Psenicka and Admin Assistant Kelly Rafferty did the majority of the implementation work on our end, and additional training of overall staff will be continuing.

EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES ACTIVITY REPORT – December 2025

Ambulance Responses:

This month, EMT and Paramedic personnel responded to a total of 200 requests for emergency medical services treating a total of 213 patients. There were 157 calls located west of the IHB Railroad and 24 calls east of the IHB Railroad. We gave mutual 19 times and received it 21 times. Year to date there has been a total of 1,933 requests for emergency medical services caring for a total of 1,959 patients.

This compares to last year (December 2024) when there were 187 requests for service treating 188 patients and year to date totals were 1,945 requests for service treating 1,942 patients.

Training and Continuing Education:

Paramedic Tolf taught CPR to the LaGrange Park Police Department on December 11th and 22nd.

TRAINING ACTIVITY REPORT – DECEMBER 2025

This month department personnel recorded a total of 524 hours of training. This includes regularly scheduled training for daytime staffing, weekly nighttime and daytime department drills, EMS continued Education, and any additional training, certificate programs or coursework attended outside of the department. Throughout the month, members of the department were able to complete annual OSHA required training, annual FIT testing, and took advantage of an acquired structure for commercial forced entry training at 545 Sherwood. Additionally, several members completed recertification through the OSFM in the following topics: Fire Apparatus Engineer, Fire Service Vehicle Operator, Fire Investigator, Fire Service Instructor I/II, and Hazmat Operations.
